Magia Naturalis by Erika Szőke is an anthology of unique approaches to photography and video. It combines well-known photographic techniques, such as Kirlian photography, which is created using high voltage with the artist's experiments, anthotypes made using light-sensitive turmeric or prints created with soil, mushroom spores, and spirulina (blue-green algae). Szőke removes toxic substances and life-threatening materials from traditional photographic processes, and in her videos, she often employs the natural properties of materials and the inspiring abilities of single-celled organisms to express movement and change.

The sustainability of the world we know is elevated to the primary concern in her current artistic practice. Her vanishing images remind us that we can all understand, at least on an instinctive level, the signs embedded in our present lives.

Erika Szőke (born 1977, Šurany):

A Slovak photographer of Hungarian descent, she studied in the studio of Karol Baron at the Department of Fine Arts and Education at Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra. Her works explore the relationship between humans, nature, and the environment, reflected in her ecological approaches and methods of creation, where she combines visual art with scientific discoveries and inventions. Through her works, she captures traces, imprints, and "fossils" of the past, as well as personal, familial, and historical memory. She portrays a kind of poetry of transience, aiming to capture the perceived moment and reflect on the nature of impermanence. Szőke focuses on the complex relationship between the original view of the world and its trace in the form of a photograph, between the appearance of analog and digital images, and the impression left in often contradictory materials. She tirelessly experiments with the technological possibilities of photography, often choosing her approach and apparatus based on the desired result, and frequently works against the will of the apparatus itself to achieve a change in atmosphere or a different associative quality.

She lives and works in Veľký Kýr and regularly exhibits in Slovakia and abroad.
